JERRY MATTHEWS

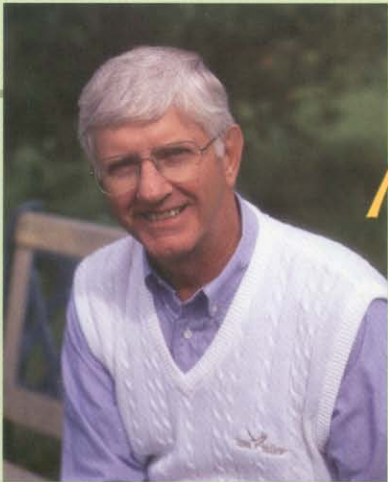

A graduate of Michigan State University (Landscape Architecture '56, Urban Planning '60, MA Urban Planning '64) and past president of the American Society of Golf Course Architects (1993), Jerry Matthews has designed more than 100 new golf courses throughout Michigan and across the country. In recent years his Michigan designs have included the Lakes Course at Michaywe (Gaylord), Timber Ridge (East Lansing), Elk Ridge (Atlanta), St. Ives (Stanwood) and Timberstone (Iron Mountain) — all honored by *Golf Digest* as being among the top five new public course designs in their respective years.

Matthews will be discussing various design elements, with particular focus on one of his specialties, wetlands management.

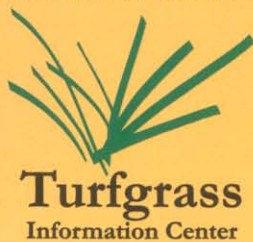
A graduate of Michigan State University (Turfgrass Science '83, Landscape Architecture '89) and member of the American Society of Golf Course Architects, Ray Hearn has been involved in numerous original course designs and remodeling projects since opening his own firm in 1996. Michigan courses recognized by *Golf Digest* include The Grande (Jackson) and Hemlock (Ludington), which was also noted by *Golf Magazine* as a Top Ten New Course. Additionally, Hearn is an instructor with the acclaimed "Golf Architecture in the British Isles," which is taught on location in Great Britain.

Hearn will be discussing the design process for his award-winning Mistwood Golf Course in Romeoville, Illinois.

The Architect's Gallery is a cooperative project of the American Society of Golf Course Architects (ASGCA) and the Turfgrass Information Center (TIC) at Michigan State University. The Gallery depicts the accomplishments of golf course architects enhanced with links to content in the TIC's Turfgrass Information File. As a resource for students, scholars, practitioners and others, individual pages for each architect can include:

- Biographical information and firm contact
- A video interview (in total or segmented), from the ASGCA Living History Series
- A list of courses by the architect, with links to course websites, architectural plans, or additional features
- A featured hole profile from the ASGCA Architect's Corner Library
- A link to articles listed in the Turfgrass Information File by or about the architect

THE TURFGRASS INFORMATION CENTER is located in the Michigan State University Libraries. The Center was established in 1984 with initial and ongoing support from the United States Golf Association. Its aim is to organize and index the literature of turf so that students, practitioners and researchers can easily locate information relevant to their efforts. Home to the O.J. Noer Memorial Turfgrass Collection and the James B Beard Turfgrass Library Collection, the Center comprises the largest turfgrass information collection in the world. Access to the collection is facilitated via the **Turfgrass Information File (TGIF)**,

a database including over 100,000 records to turfgrass resources and turf-related disciplines.

THE TURFGRASS INFORMATION CENTER ENDOWMENT will provide the financial resources to ensure the ongoing operations of the Center. The annual interest generated by the principal, which remains untouched, is available for the continued operations of the Center regardless of fluctuations in State and/or University support. Monies from the endowment will enhance TIC's efforts, including: continued expansion of access to the Turfgrass Information File via the World Wide Web (tic.msu.edu); added content; and additional electronic access to full text.
