



The Turfgrass Information Center (TIC) was created in 1983 at Michigan State University Libraries. One of the primary functions of the Center is to maintain and add to TGIF, the Turfgrass Information File database.

In addition to traditional turfgrass research questions, all sorts of questions can be answered with TGIF:

Did you know that there are several public full-text electronic resources that can be reached from the TIC website? As a subscriber, your institution has access to many more full-text electronic resources as well.



Did you know that you can use the Turfgrass Information File (TGIF) to find information on the use of turfgrass as lawns, as golf courses, as shoulders on roads, athletics fields, parks, or used in cemeteries?



Did you know that TGIF can be used to support programs in Landscape Architecture and Design, Horticulture, Parks and Recreation Facility Operation, Grounds and Landscape Management, and Environmental Policy? Of course, TGIF is the best there is in Turfgrass Science.



Do undergraduates at your institution write interdisciplinary papers on wide ranging topics such as the impact of humans on watersheds? TGIF can provide informations relevant to the topic.




By subscribing, users can access a wealth of additional full-text electronic resources, plus utilize the database itself to identify other relevant information. Materials indexed by the Turfgrass Information File include articles from peer reviewed publications, technical reports and conference proceedings, trade and professional publications, local professional newsletters, and popular magazines as well as monographs, theses and dissertations, fact sheets and brochures, software, and web documents. TGIF indexes materials from government, college/university, professional organizations, and private publishers. Our goal is to provide indexed access to the entirety of the turfgrass literature, regardless of date of publication, format, language, audience, or industry sector with as much full-text content as can be arranged!






Subject Coverage

The Turfgrass Information Center selects materials according to a broad definition of turfgrass. Turfgrass is defined as grass or grass-like ground covers used in golf courses, parks, sports fields, lawns, sod farms, roadsides, institutional grounds, and for other utility, recreational, or aesthetic purposes. Subjects covered by TGIF include:
