

Noer Memorial Turfgrass Collection materials residing in the Center and the James B Beard Turfgrass Library Collection, which are housed next to each other.

Recently the Turfgrass Information Center was also fortunate enough to have a large scale reorganization in the production area of the Center. Previously, all of the loose articles we kept (those whose record says "Available from TIC Sequential File=X") were stored in varying sizes of lateral filing cabinets. As it turns out, these were not very space efficient! Now these files are housed in vertical file cabinets. Thanks to Adam Leenheer for his design and layouts and the help of Jay Johnson and his libraries facilities crew, the new floor plan was put together in no time. Now the production area of TIC looks nicer and is much more organized.
