USGA Turfgrass Information File O.J. Noer Memorial Turfgrass Collection Michigan State University Libraries

"TOPICS" FILES

Based on feedback from users and the USGA Turfgrass Research Committee, we have a new "System Main Menu" item called "Download Topics". Selecting one of the listed topics (using the cursor keys or the number associated with a file) will download it directly to your PC. Each file is a pre-searched bibliography on that topic, usually 3 or 4 pages long. Records are in a very short form, and include the USGA TGIF record number so you can "go back" and look at a complete record, if you wish to. A sample of this format is shown below:

To see the complete USGA TGIF record for a citation listed below, D)isplay the record # listed at the end of the citation in the ALL format at the Command Line in LISGA TGIF.

USER'S QUESTIONS

Q. How can my phone lines influence online searching?

A. Phone lines can have a <u>major</u> influence on how well your online session starts and goes. <u>Some</u> of the variables include:

1) Static (noise) on the line -

If you get static or other "noise" on the line when you talk, it will probably reek havoc with your modem. Local weather can also be a major factor here.

Fancy phones -

The newer phones and services can also make trouble; for example, call forwarding, call advisory, etc. can all confuse a modem.

No easy answers here, you have to experiment a bit! Call if you're not sure about your telephone quality.

ACADEMIC'S CORNER

Theses & Dissertations

We are hoping to have an exhaustive listing of every turf thesis and dissertation within USGA TGIF. A recent push on these items has strengthened our coverage (but not holdings) greatly, though most are shortform records. We would appreciate hearing about any theses or dissertations in turf which are not yet listed in USGA TGIF, and would appreciate even more copies of any which we do not yet own. (If there is no "Call No." listed in the ALL or KEEPERS display format of a record, we do not own it.)



NEW FEATURES ONLINE...

Managing Your Own .LST File

Whenever you download a search which you have W)ritten inside USGA TGIF, it is downloaded to your PC as "xxx.lst", where "xxx" is your log-on initials. At our end, this file of yours acts as a kind of holding work-space where you can temporarily store materials before you download them. If you don't download the file at all, or don't finish downloading it, it remains intact. It is now possible for you to manage this file yourself. Each time you enter the STAR database software, the system will check to see if you have an .lst file already. If you do, a "warning" screen will present you with four alternatives:

- Continue on into STAR and leave the xxx.lst file intact.
- Look at the contents of the file, to see what you had "set aside" already, and then return to this screen again.
- 3) <u>Delete</u> the file and continue on into STAR.
- 4) Go back to the "System Main Menu".

As a practical matter, this can be used not only to check carryovers between different sessions, but also within a session. Thus, if you aren't sure exactly what you W)rote:

- Exit USGA TGIF and STAR to the "System Main Menu", and
- 2) Press <RETURN> to again enter STAR.

You can then look at the contents you have ready to download (#2) and then go back to the "System Main Menu" (#4) in order to finish the download if all is well.

Delay in Log-Off Screen

Many users commented on how quickly the log-off detail screen (telling you how long you had been connected at our end) "went past". A delay and simplification of this screen has now been built in, giving you 5 seconds to do a screen print.


JAPANESE VISITORS




